

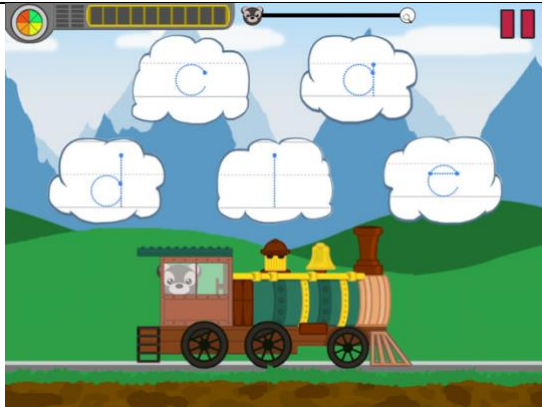
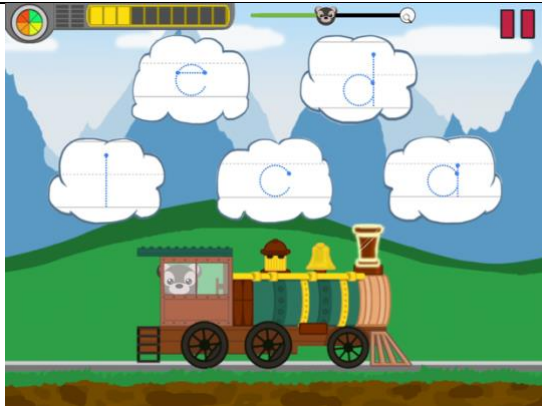
Sample Lesson from the Letter Identification App (LIA)

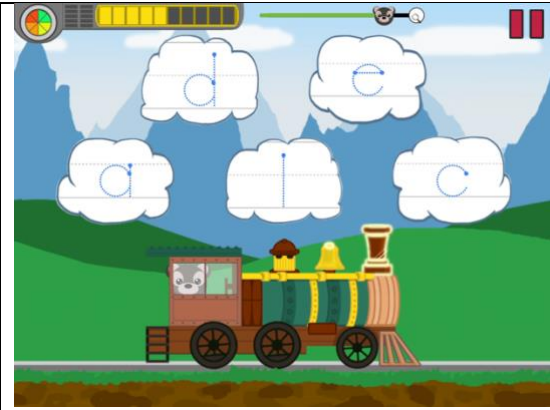
Note: For this sample Lesson 5, the letter L was taught in Lesson 4. The letter E was the new letter in Lesson 3, letter A in Lesson 2, and letter C in Lesson 1. The letter L will appear more frequently in the first half of Lesson 5 until the new letter D is introduced.

Note: This sample lesson does not show feedback or corrections, just general instruction, and format of the lesson. LIA has a robust and thorough feedback and correction system depending on the outcome of the task.

	2. Trace the first row of humps. 3. Trace the next row of Ls.

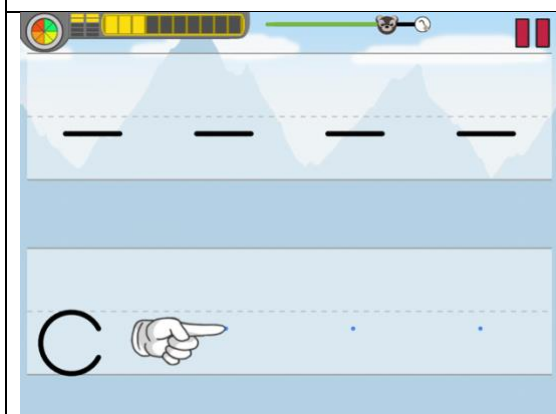

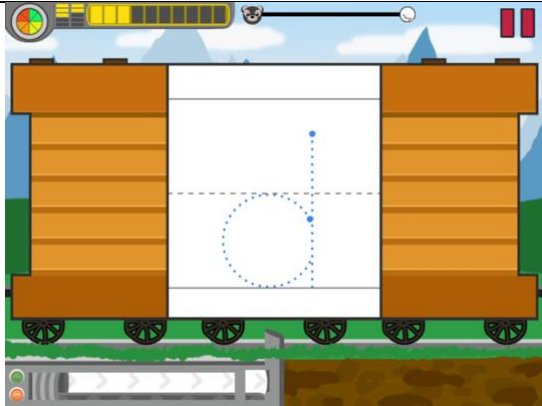
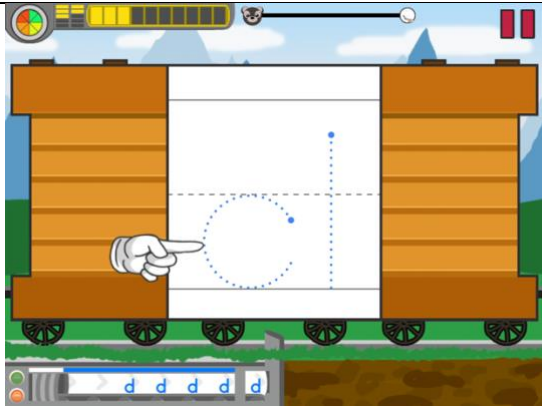
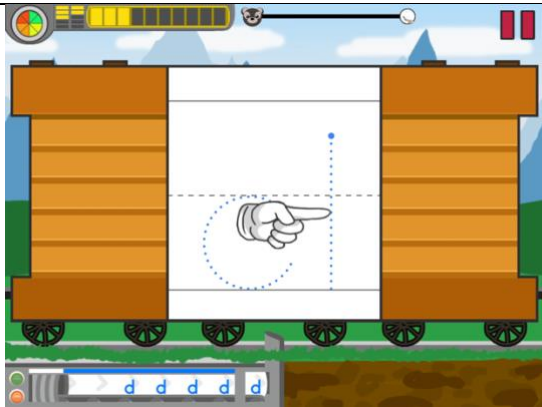


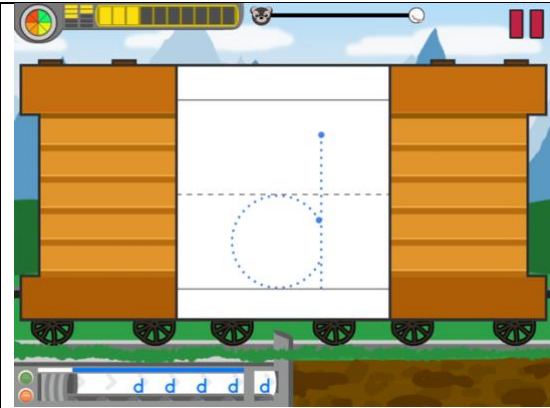
- I'll show you how to write this C. I touch the starting dot and start writing. The dots appear after I start writing C, then I trace the rest of it.
